EMMA Con tomate, gracias. ¿Cuánto es en total?	EMMA With tomato, thank you. How much is it in total?
CARLOS Son dos euros con cincuenta.	CARLOS That's two euros fifty.
EMMA Aquí tiene. Quédese con el cambio.	EMMA Here you are. Keep the change.
CARLOS ¡Muy amable! ¿Es usted de vacaciones?	CARLOS Very kind of you! Are you on holiday?
EMMA Sí, llegué ayer. Me encanta Sevilla. ¡El café es delicioso!	EMMA Yes, I arrived yesterday. I love Seville. The coffee is delicious!
CARLOS ¡Bienvenida! Que disfrute de su visita.	CARLOS Welcome! Enjoy your visit.
